

- Those Veterinarians who have not registered or renewed their registration as per the Act and if any negligence occurs within that period, he/she may face the criminal/legal consequences thereof and he/she will be solely responsible for the same.
- All the members are also requested to inform the Council for any change in postal address, mobile number, working place, e-mail address etc to update their record in the Council.
- According to the I.V.C. Act, 1984, Section 30(a), no person other than a registered veterinarian, shall hold office as veterinary physician or surgeon or any other like office (by whatever name called) in Government or in any institution maintained by a local or other authority.

The World Veterinary Association has decided to celebrate World Veterinary Day (WVD) on the last Saturday of April every year as an annual celebration of the veterinary profession, to promote the work of veterinary professionals from all over the world. Each year, the WVA and World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) choose unique theme for celebration of the day. The theme of World Veterinary Day 28th April, 2018 was "The Role of the Veterinary Profession in Sustainable Development to Improve Livelihoods, Food Security and Safety." The WVD was celebrated by Veterinary fraternity of the state at Town Hall, Gandhinagar. On this occasion, a seminar was hosted by AGVSST (All Gujarat Veterinarians' Social Security Trust) on above theme.



Dr. P. H. Vataliya (I/c Vice Chancellor, Kamdhenu University) presided over the function, while Dr. A. J. Kachhiapatel (Director of Animal Husbandry, Gujarat State) was the Guest of Honour. Dr. A. M. Thaker (Dean, College of Veterinary Science & A. H., Anand), Dr. N. H. Kelawala (Dean, Vanbandhu College of Veterinary Science & A. H., Navsari) and Dr. D. V. Joshi (Dean, College of Veterinary Science & A. H., Sardarkrushinagar) were the Guests dignifying the dais.

The function began with a melodic prayer from Dr. K. P. Gajera (Assistant Director of A. H., A.V.I.) followed by welcome speech from Dr. S. T. • Accomplishment of Gujarat under Rashtriya Gokul Mission (RGM)



Nominations submitted by the Gujarat state under various categories of National Awards under Rashtriya Gokul Mission (RGM) viz. National Gopal Ratna Award, National Kamdhenu Award, RGM Best A.I. Technician, Best Field Veterinarian and Best Performing State Award have been adjudged by the Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, Government of India. Gujarat has made a remarkable achievement this year by securing 2nd position under RGM Best Performing State Award for the West Zone; Dr. A. J. KachhiaPatel, Director of Animal husbandry, Gujarat state received Certificate of merit, Memento and a Cash Incentive of Rs. 21,000/from Hon'ble State Minister of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Smt. Krishna Raj on the occasion of World Milk Day celebration on 1st June, 2018 at A. P. Shinde Hall, NASC Complex, Pusa, New Delhi. Apart from that, Gujarat secured 1st, 2nd and 3rd position for National Kamdhenu Awards; 2nd and 3rd position for National Gopal Ratna Awards; 1st position for RGM Best Artificial Insemination Technician Awards (three nominations) for the West Zone.

• District Panchayat, Anand

District Panchayat, Anand has shown significant progress in last few years with regards to animal health services by developing very good infrastructure facilities for modern surgery and diagnostic equipment.



Animal Husbandry branch of District Panchayat, Anand worked in co-ordination with R & B Division and within last four years, approximately 2.74 crores of grant has been utilized by R & B department for renovation and new construction work of several Veterinary Dispensaries (VD) and First Aid Veterinary Centres (FAVC) in the district. In addition, financial provision of approximately 4 crores is made in the 2018-19 budget of Animal Husbandry department for strengthening infrastructure of veterinary units.



In Anand district, doorstep veterinary service is being provided by ARDA (AMUL) on large scale since long and hence, in order to provide specialized diagnostic and surgical facilities along with utilizing the technical competence of Post-graduate Veterinary Officers working under District Panchayat Anand, modern facilities have been established. These include Gaseous anaesthesia machine with ventilator, Air conditioned operation theatre for small animals, Air conditioned OPD room

for small animals, Thermocautery, Blood cell counter, Exigo four parts, Three in one Biochemistry and Electrolyte analyser, Multipara Patient Monitoring at Veterinary Dispensary, Petlad and X-ray with CR system, Air conditioned operation theatre for small animals, Thermocautery, Suction pump for suction of fluid during surgery, Orthopedic surgical set, Mobile Ultrasonography machine and equipment for soft and hard tissue surgeries at Veterinary Dispensary, Borsad under MNSPSY, MP-MLA fund, Swabhandol fund, Departmental grant,

Discretion grants of the Collector and DDO as well as Donation. The LN₂ Silo has also been established by GLDB (Gujarat Livestock Development Board).

VD Petlad was recently chosen as place for PVS (Performance of Veterinary Services) evaluation by OIE, Paris. The VD is also one of the internship centre for Veterinary internship students of Anand Agricultural University,



Anand and Training and Internship centre for D.V.Sc. students of Navsari Agricultural University, Navsari.

Recently, several successful soft tissue and orthopedic surgeries have been carried out at Veterinary Dispensary levels which include two Esophagotomy in buffalo, several Caesarean section in small and large ruminants, Intramedullary pinning in dog and peacock, Spaying in dog, Mammary tumour in dog, Varicose vein surgery of buffalo tail and Haemangiosarcoma in dog.



The future plan of District Panchayat Anand is to provide modern diagnostic facilities at Taluka Veterinary Dispensaries as well as to provide improved extension and training services for Animal Husbandry practices.

Chhotaudepur on 24th January 2018 afternoon. More than 115 dairy farmers participated in the Shibir. Dr. A J Dhami, Dr. J A Patel, Dr. D M Patel, Dr. G C Mandali, Dr. J K Mahla and Dr. R J Modi from Veterinary College delivered subject specific significant and farmers friendly



tips on animal breeding, feeding, housing, health care, heifer raising etc including measures to control contagious diseases and infertility in their animals. A very good interaction with farmers and faculty was held during this Shibir that motivated the poor folk of the region towards sound animal husbandry practices.

"Animal Health cum Surgical Camps" were organized simultaneously at two Village, viz., Khadakwada and Diyavant, Ta/Dist. Chhotaudepur on 25th January 2018. More than 305 dairy animals were brought for general health checkup, deworming, nutritional supplements and treatment of various skin disorders, infertility, pregnancy diagnosis including castration in these two camps. The faculty and post-graduate students from Veterinary College took part in the camps. The camps were successfully organized and sponsored by Shroffs Foundation Trust in the tribal belt. Their officers namely Mr. Vikas Vaze CEO, Mr. M A Makwana, Sr. Programme Officer, Mr. Mahendra Patel, Head Development and a large team canvassed and coordinated the event.

• Animal Health cum Fertility Camp

The college in collaboration with 'Naman Coop Milk Producers' Society, Naman' and NSS wing of N.V. Patel College of Pure & Applied Sciences, Vallabh Vidyanagar organized "Animal Health cum Fertility Camp" at Village Naman, Ta. Borsad, Anand on 5th January 2018. Dr. A.J. Dhami & Dr. J.A. Patel, Gynaecologists and Dr. G.C. Mandali, Clinician with 6 UG/PG students from Veterinary College, Anand participated in the Health Camp and rendered their expertise services. In all, 45 animals were examined and treated mainly for skin infection and infertility. Farmers were advised for improved livestock health care and management including importance of nutritional management for resolving infertility issues that arise mainly due to malnutrition and negligence of health care, heat detection and timely breeding.

• Kisan Goshti at Kapila Gau Sanshodhan Kendra, Minawada

Kisan Goshti was jointly organized by ATMA Project, Thasra and Kapila Gau Sanshodhan Kendra, Minawada on 08-01-2018 at Minawada. Shree S.N. Vasava, Agricultural Assistant welcomed the farmers and discussed about the management of fodder production for dairy animals. Dr. V. P. Belsare, Research Scientist and Head, discussed the role of women in livestock farming. He gave the detailed information on importance



of milk production for economic livestock rearing. Dr. C. P. Parmar, Assistant Research Scientist provided information about the importance of keeping the record of farm animals for efficient management of farms. • Canine health check-up and anti-rabies vaccination campaign

The camp was organized with an aim to bring awareness about rabies amongst the people of Mehsana city. This camp was part of ongoing educational activity of department of

medicine besides a humble contribution towards animal welfare and human health. Post graduate students of Medicine department actively participated in this



camp. Dr. K. M. Jadhav, Professor & Head, Department of Medicine guided and graced the programme. Dr. A. N. Suthar, Dr. A. S. Prajapati, Dr. Sarita Devi, Dr. Prajawalita Sutariya, Dr. Bhupamani Das and Shri B. S. Patel, Laboratory technician actively supported and rendered their services to pet owners. A total of 58 dogs were benefited besides police dogs for free vaccination and checkup. Electrocardiogram of affected dog was also performed to check the functional status of heart. Blood

and skin samples were collected and checked for anemia and presence of skin diseases.

• FAO - ICAR recognition for "Indian Network on Fisheries and Animal Antimicrobial Resistance (INFAAR)" collaborating center

Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) has been recognized as a global problem and is the third issue discussed in UN general assembly, only after HIV and



Ebola. As a follow up work on national action plan, ICAR conceptualized "Indian Network on Fisheries and Animal Antimicrobial Resistance (INFAAR)" under the technical support from FAO. Under this project ICAR institutes working on Animal Health as well as three state agricultural universities working on bacterial isolation, identification and antimicrobial susceptibility testing have been included in this project. SDAU is one among the three state agricultural universities included in the said project. It's a pride moment for SDAU and Veterinary College to participate in such a national

project which will work on a global problem of AMR under the aegis of FAO. Dr. H. C. Chauhan Professor and Head, Department of Veterinary Microbiology, has been identified a s a key person for the same. Earlier Dr. Jyoti Misri, Nodal Officer on AMR and Dr. Smita Singhal, FAO consultant of ICMR visited Department of Veterinary Microbiology and Animal Biotechnology of the College and appreciated the facilities for implementation of work on AMR. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of SDAU Prof.(Dr.) Ashok A. Patel assured both the officials to extend full fledge support of the University.

• National Conference on Animal Production and Management

SDAU in collaboration with Indian Society of Animal Production and Management organized National Conference on "Smallholders Livestock Producers' in India: Opportunities and Challenges" and 25th Annual Convention of the Society during 11 to 13th April, 2018 at Sardarkrushinagar. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, SDAU, Sardarkrushinagar presided over the inaugural function and Dr. Joykrushna Jena, Deputy Director General (Animal Science), ICAR, New Delhi was the Chief Guest. Dr. A. J. Kachhiapatel, Director Animal Husbandry, Gujarat State and Dr. A. M. Patel, Director of Research

and Dean P G Studies, SDAU were Guests of Honour. A total of 209 Scientists, Teachers, Research Scholars and representatives from Government agencies from all



over India participated in the conference. It was a three days deliberation having 9 Scientific sessions during which several research papers on various aspects of animal health and management were presented and discussed at length. The issues relevant to poor productivity of our livestock population, export of livestock products, conservation and improvement of different breeds and production of quality products were discussed with suitable suggestions and solutions. Hon'ble Minister of State, Water Resources (Independent Charge), Water Supply Shri Parbatbhai Savabhai Patel, was the Chief Guest of the valedictory function. He emphasized that deliberations that emerged out during the event would be an opportunity for participants to develop linkages for future collaborations among producers, processors, planners and scientists.

Workshop on "Indian livestock farming and use of biotechnology- "MILAN 2018"

A one-day workshop on "Indian livestock farming and use of biotechnology- MILAN 2018" was organized by Department of Animal Biotechnology and Veterinary Microbiology in collaboration with National Institute

of Animal Biotechnology, Hyderabad on 28th June, 2018. A total of 200 participants including farmers, university teachers, scientists, students and veterinarians from co-operative dairies and state Animal Husbandry Department participated in this meet.

The workshop was inaugurated by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) Ashok A. Patel in the presence of Chief

Guest, Dr. Falguni Additional Thakar, Director, State Animal Husbandry Department; Dr. A. M. Patel, Director of Research PGs: Dean Dr. Chauhan, R. M.



Registrar & HRD; Dr. H. N. Kher, Ex-Registrar; Dr. D. V. Joshi, Dean; Dr. B. S. Chandel, Professor, Animal Biotechnology; Dr. Suresh Gokhle, Consultant, NIAB and Dr. Sarwar, Scientist NIAB. Two technical sessions were held for invited lectures on animal production and animal diseases. Two experts from NIAB interacted with farmers and scientists and collected feedback on animal health, nutrition, management and breeding practices directly from the farmers and field veterinarians with a questionnaire. The farmers from different districts viz., Banaskantha, Sabarkantha, Mehsana, Patan, Dahod, Narmada presented their problems related to animal husbandry before the house and obtained satisfactory resolution. Some of the farmers put forth their experiences about traditional managemental practices and ethno veterinary treatments.

• Expert Talks and Hands On Training

Dr. Ramsi P. Chaudhary, Medical Director, VCA Dunmore Animal Hospital, PA, USA visited Veterinary College on 13-03-2018. He gave practical demonstration on quick technique of overo-hysterectomy operation in bitch to UG, PG students and staff members of TVCC, Deesa. He also explained possible complications and solutions. In Afternoon hours, a lecture was arranged for UG and PG students. • Surgical Management of Atresia Ani in a cow calf (Dr. J. K. Tank, Dr. K. G. Brahmaxatri and Dr. R.D. Patel; Pashupalan Branch, District Panchayat Kutch)



Intestinal atresia has been reported as a congenital defect in all species of domestic animals. The congenital abnormalities of the anus and rectum are fairly common in young ones. A three-day-old male cow calf of Kankrej breed was presented with the complain of inability to pass the faeces.

On clinical observation, it was found that the calf was not having anal opening. There was soft subcutaneous swelling below the ischial arch with distension of abdomen. The signs of tenesmus and abdominal pain were observed. The case was diagnosed as atresia ani and planned for surgery.

Local infiltration at the site of incision using 2% lignocaine hydrochloride solution was done. Antibiotics and NSAID (Ceftriaxone salbanctum 10 g/kg i/m and Meloxicam 0.2 mg/kg s/c were given. A circular incision was made upon the bulge of the anus and the circular piece was incised and skin was removed. Muconium came out immediately. The patency of opening was maintained by application of interrupted sutures by black silk # 2 between rectal mucosa and skin to make a permanent anal orifice Post-

operatively, the surgical wound was cleaned and dressed regularly with liquid Povidone iodine and ointment Acrilin was applied daily till recovery. The sutures were removed on 10th post-operative day.

• A Case of Enucleation of Eye in Shih Tzu Dog (Dr. J. K. Tank, Dr. K. G. Brahmaxatri and Dr. R.D. Patel; Pashupalan Branch, District Panchayat Kutch)

Enucleation refers to the surgical removal of the entire eye. Enucleation surgery is common procedure in small animals. It is indicated when an eye is painful or infected and vision cannot be regained.



A case was presented with history of trauma to left eye by the other dog during playing and tarsorrhaphy was done by local vet, but after a week, the owner noticed discharge from the eye with bad smell. There was a loss of vision and half of the eye globe was outside of the orbit cavity with discharge and hence it was decided to enucleate eye to save the life of dog.

Xylazine 1mg/kg i/m and atropine sulphate 0.02 mg/kg were used for pre-anaesthesia and 5mg/kg i/v bolus for anaethesia induction and for maintenance as per need. Antibiotics and NSAID (Ceftriaxone salbanctum 10 g/kg and Carprofen 4 mg/kg s/c) were given.

After positioning the animal and surgical site sterilization, first eyelids were closed with continues suture pattern, then using 11 no. scalpel blade, elliptical full thickness incision was made about 5mm away from eyelid margin and joint incision at medial and lateral canthus; then using tissue forceps, eyelid margins were grasped and blunt dissection was done using curved scissor around the eye until a whole globe was free from the orbital rim. Clamping and ligation of optic nerve and blood vessels were done with absorbable 3-0 vycryle suture material once globe was removed. Pressure gauze was applied to stop the bleeding, and the incision was closed with non-absorbable sutures with simple interrupted method. After 7 days, sutures were removed and dog recovered uneventfully.

 Recurrent Prolapse in cows (Dr. H. M. Dudhat, Veterinary Officer, Baroda Dairy)

A novel method to treat nonpregnant cows and buffaloes suffering from prolapse at every heat of estrus cycle has been adopted. In these types of cases, when the cows or buffaloes come in estrous, the cervical part of the uterine



track comes out from the vagina. Due to this infected cervical part, A.I. or natural service is not possible and animal remains non-pregnant.

As a part of treatment, replace the prolapsed mass after washing with potassium permanganent solution under epidural block with injection of 2% lignocaine. Suture the vulvar lips and treat the case with suitable antibiotics and intra uterine solution.

After that, start hormonal treatment as follows.

- Injection GNRH (Receptal) 2.5ml/im zero day.
- On the 7th day at 4:00 pm, injection PGF2∞ 2 ml/ im (Estrumate)
- On the 9th day at 4:00 pm, injection GNRH (Receptal) 2.5 ml/im
- On the 10th day, A.I. must be done during 8:00 am to 3:00 pm
- Don't remove sutures at the time of A.I.
- Pass the A.I. gun in between two sutures on vulvar lips.



- Regularly washing of sutures with antiseptic solution.
- Remove sutures from vulvar lips after 8 to 10 days.

On the 10th day, animal will be in estrus because of synchronization. Check the animal for pregnancy after 60 days. By this method, probability of conception will be increased.
