: GVC NEWS:

- An Advisory is issued for proper implementation of immunization and birth control of stray dogs. It has been brought to the notice of the Animal Welfare Board of India that the sterilized dogs are not notched after sterilization resulting in most of these dogs being picked once again and go through the trauma of the procedure of sterilization a second time. It is therefore advised that all veterinary doctors who carry out sterilization of dogs (street dogs & owned dogs) shall follow all the norms prescribed under the ABC (Dogs) Rules, 2001 including ear notching and immunization of the sterilized dogs for rabies and also keep a record of the sterilization carried out and forward it with the details of the geographical areas/ address and the date of carrying out the sterilization and immunization to the civic bodies and the Animal Welfare Board of India on a regular basis.
- The Veterinary Council of India has decided to conduct the All India Pre-Veterinary Test (AIPVT) for filling up 15% of the total number of seats in the Veterinary colleges for the next year 2013 on 11th May, 2013 (Saturday) from 2.00 to 5.00 P.M. The detail information will be available on www.vci.nic.in
- Total 850 members have renewed their GVC registration and 150 members have received their final certificates and i-cards.
- As on 31/12/2012, GVC has 3466 registered members.

: ANIMAL HUSBANDRY DEPARTMENT :

19th Livestock Census-2012 in Gujarat

The Livestock Census is being carried out quninquininally in the country since 1919-20, where enumeration of livestock resources in every household of the country is made. This source of database is invaluable for proper planning and formulation of any strategic intervention for further improvement and development in the Livestock Sector. Presently, 19th Livestock Census is being undertaken in the state along with the country under the instructions, guidance and supervision of the Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture, GOI, New Delhi. In the current livestock census, the enumeration task has been accomplished during 15th Sept to 15th October, 2012. Approximately 22,000 Enumerators and 3,000 General/Technical Supervisors were appointed for this task in all the districts of Gujarat State. More than 50 Officials of the Directorate

were also engaged for training and supervision of the work. The importance of 19th Livestock Census work was publicized among people of the state using local Media, T.V., Radio, Press etc. The data collected in enumeration will be further scrutinized and analyzed using software to prepare districtwise/Taluka wise report of Livestock Census. These reports will be published officially upon the final approval of Government of India.

Gujarat's leap to 4th rank in milk production

During the Year 2011-12, Gujarat State has recorded milk production of 98.17 lakh MT and leaped to 4th rank in the Country as compared to 5th position in the last year. The state has been at 5th position in terms of milk production since year 2003-04 to 2010-11. The milk production of the State in 2011-12 has indicated the growth rate of 5.32 % as compared to the production of 2010-11 (93.21 lakh MT). Gujarat State is ahead of the prosperous states like Punjab, Haryana and Maharashtra in terms of milk production. Gujarat State also enjoys the highest number of Milk Producer Members (31.03 lakh) under Milk Cooperative Network with highest milk procurement (101.38 lakh litres per day) in the Country.

Tarnetar Pashu Pradarshan Fair



Since 2008, Directorate of Animal Husbandry organizes a State level Livestock Show "Pashu Pradarshan Harifai" during every Tarnetar Fair, where pedigreed elite livestock breeds of cow, buffalo and horse participate in various events and prizes are given to the winners. It also provides best platform to farmers for exchange of their knowledge of rearing animals, purchase/sale of livestock and true breed characters of the livestock. In the current year, this exhibition and competition was organized during 18th-20th September, 2012 at Tarnetar, in which 253 animals participated and 39 prizes were awarded. Every year, the fair seems only to grow in popularity, attracting visitors and tourists from Gujarat, elsewhere in India, and even abroad.

The organization of Livestock Show at this fair has added a different and distinct colour to this fair, which is already famous for its colourful, glittering and spirited ambience.

 Dr. Snehal Patel (Veterinary Officer, Veterinary Polyclinic, Vadodara) attended a Conference of Association of Avian Veterinarians, U.S.A., at Louisville, Kentucky, U.S.A. from 11 to 15th Aug. 2012. Except for U.S.A. and Canada, this organization



offers only one scholarship to a veterinarian who is engaged in avian medicine. The most important aspect of this conference was "Hands on training on Avian Anaesthesia on live birds" and "Hands on training on Avian Orthopedics on frozen birds". Dr. Snehal got exposure to different anesthesia and orthopedic techniques for fracture repair of different birds. He also attended presentations on treatment of exotic pets and pet birds, aviculture, avian conservation, avian surgery along with safe recovery and rehabilitation of avian patients.


Twenty one scientists/faculty from different states of India participated. Eminent scientists from different areas of Biotechnology were invited as speakers in this event like Dr. D. N. Kamra, Dr. Dada Saheb, Dr. Prashant, Dr. P. U. Krishnaraj and others. Apart from speakers from Gujarat and India, 3 lectures were conducted via video conferencing by Dr. Dipti Pitta from Ruminant nutrition, Department of Clinical Studies, University of Pennsylvania; Dr. Madan Thangavelu of Cambridge University and Dr. Sarah Hunter from EBI, Cambridge, UK. Initially, the participants were introduced to the basic concept of Next generation sequencing (NGS) and its importance, later on it was followed by lectures on the application of the Metagenomics and NGS into different areas of biological sciences.

Department of Veterinary Surgery & Radiology, College of Veterinary Science & A. H., Anand organized 36th Annual congress of Indian Society for Veterinary Surgery and International Symposium from 1st November to 3rd November, 2012. · Lifting the veil of mystery surrounding bats

Few animals have suffered more from negative publicity than the bat. Nature's only winged mammal is frequently depicted in folklore and films as destructive, unhealthy and unattractive. Increasing concern about the bat's potential for spreading disease to other animals and humans has contributed to the suspicion that often surrounds the animal. A manual published by the UN Food and Agriculture Organization aims to help countries minimize the risks to public health, while protecting the vital role that bats play in agriculture and the environment.

The guide, "Investigating the Role of Bats in Emerging Zoonoses: Balancing Ecology, Conservation and Public Health Interest," is a hands-on reference to bat history, biology, monitoring, handling, and disease screening. The text is especially relevant as diseases transmitted by bats appear to be on the rise for various reasons. Agricultural expansion and the use of natural resources are encroaching on bat-occupied territories, leading to increase in the interaction between bats, livestock and people. Understanding the changes that affect these populations is critical to addressing the risks, and limiting

the exchange, of viruses between species. The publication is designed for use by epidemiologists, wildlife officials, farmers, livestock veterinarians, zoologists, and any number of different professionals who might come into contact with bats. It was written by veterinarians, wildlife biologists, virologists, and disease experts, and includes field techniques for studying bats and infectious agents that do not cause disease in bats, but which can cause other animals or humans to become sick.

 A new open-access information system on animal feed resources launched by FAO

Feedipedia is an open access encyclopedia of animal feed resources that provides information, in the form of 'Feed datasheets', on nature, occurrence, distribution, chemical composition, nutritional value and safe use of nearly 1400 livestock feed resources. The Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), in collaboration with the *Institut National de la Recherche Agronomique (INRA)*, the Centre de coopération international en recherche agronomique pour le développement (CIRAD) and the Association française de zootechnie (AFZ), has set up 'Feedipedia'. It is based on FAO's previous Animal Feed Resources Information System (AFRIS) and has been rechristened as Feedipedia – Animal Feed Resources Information System. It is jointly managed jointly by INRA, CIRAD, AFZ and FAO.

He further stated that 'In a recent fair in Panama, a bull was on offer for a base price of Rs. 3 Crores.

Murrah Buffalo Bull's price was placed at Rs. One Crore by its owner Shri Karamveer, from Haryana, in an Exhibition held in Saharanpur dist. - according to a report published in a Meerut daily 'Amar Ujala' of 21st Nov. 2012. The owner of the bull (named Yuvraj) stated that the bull gets him an income of about Rs. One and half lakhs per month through its semen production. He further stated that this bull was adjudged as the best bull in Harayana and its worth is Rs One Crore.

Steve Irwin



Since October 1996, Steve Irwin served as the intense, charming and fearless host of The Crocodile Hunter Animal Planet. Using his bravery, knowledge, irrepressible enthusiasm and undeniable love of animals, Irwin rocketed into the living rooms of fans around the world to become one of the most

recognized and popular personalities on television.

Steve Irwin's life mission was to promote wildlife conservation by educating viewers in an exciting and engaging manner. The Crocodile Hunter didn't seek out the world's most dangerous and dynamic animals just for the sake of an adrenaline rush — his mission was to bring these animals into the public's common awareness, which he considered the first step in the effort of conservation. Steve and his wife, Terri, became a daring wildlife diplomatic team, who shared their passion for wildlife and the well-being of creatures large and small. Their aim was to enlighten viewers by showing that all animals are beautiful creatures deserving of respect and protection.

This passion for worldwide wildlife conservation not only made The Crocodile Hunter a success, but spawned other series including the Emmy-nominated Croc Files, Crocodile Hunter Diaries, New Breed Vets and numerous specials for Animal Planet, Discovery Channel and Travel Channel. Due to Steve's worldwide popularity as a television host and wildlife conservationist, many things at the Queensland Reptile and Fauna Park changed through the years including its name, Australia Zoo. Now over 80 acres in size, Australia Zoo contains many attractions, including the Animal Planet Crocoseum. Opened in 2004, this 5,000-seat stadium is the place where visitors see live crocodile demonstrations with close-up views on a huge screen. Steve was awarded the title "2004 Queensland Australian of the Year."

Wildlife Warriors Worldwide (www.wildlifewarriors. org) was established by Steve and Terri Irwin in 2002. Although a relatively young charity, it has achieved great success with conservation programme in Australia, Asia and Africa. This nonprofit organization is involved with a number of vital conservation programme, including wildlife research, the Koala and Wildlife Hospital, community education, wildlife rescue, crocodile conservation, cheetah conservation, tiger conservation and elephant conservation. Irwin epitomized the "wildlife warrior" philosophy because he was the original - and he even coined the term. This organization is based on the very ideals of Steve Irwin and they will live in the hearts, the conscience and in the daily lives of the Wildlife Warriors' team as they share his dream of conservation and strive to make it a reality. Wildlife Warriors is a principle partner with Animal Planet's ROAR initiative, which joins with leading animal organizations to make the world a better place for animals. Another project Steve Irwin spearheaded was The Croc Hunter's International Croc Rescue Unit, which successfully started a joint Queensland Government project attaching satellite trackers to wild crocodiles in Northern Australia for critical research into the species.

On Monday, September 4th, 2006, Steve Irwin died in a freak accident involving a stingray off the Great Barrier Reef in Australia. The world mourned his death and an outpouring of love for Steve and his mission in life was seen across the globe following this tragic accident. Steve is survived by his wife, Terri daughter Bindi, and son Robert.
